A visit to remember

Irish eyes were smiling brightly on the Lilac Festival Week visit of Limerick Mayor Kevin Kiely and Oliver O'Loughlin, Limerick's director of services.

Our area's capricious springtime weather cooperated and fond memories sprouted like dandelions (or four-leaf clover). Good planning and good luck (no volcanic ash flight delays) also helped.

Mayor Mary Verner's gracious reception in the Chase Gallery set just the right tone for the long weekend of activities. Thanks, Mayor. And thanks to all the City Council members, visiting city officials, Sister City board members, Limerick Society members and others who welcomed our visitors so warmly.

As we noted, Sister City programs are difficult to maintain without City Hall's consistent, strong support. We have been blessed with that in Spokane.

Mayor Kiely's heartfelt remarks made a great and lasting impression at the Lilac Festival dinner.

At a Saturday Limerick Board luncheon, enthusiasm flowed as high as water in the falls nearby for various initiatives, including a proposed Sister City Garden in Riverfront Park. Mayor Kiely, whose term ends in June, pledged

his and his successor's support for the garden.

Saturday night's weather – and huge turnout – could not have been better for the Lilac Festival Armed Forces Day Torchlight Parade.

Basking in the warm climate and equally warm reception as honorary grand marshal, the visiting mayor "was treated like a rock star," said Limerick President Kerry Lynch. Kerry and former Mayor Jack Geraghty joined the Limerick mayor in a vintage, stick-shift Chevy Impala. Driver Sheila Geraghty said she "only killed the engine once" during the long parade route.

With help from Mayor Kiely ("Sheila, I think you have to turn the key in the ignition..."), the honorees were quickly back on their way, parade-waving along the route to the tens of thousands of spectators who got a nice dose of Sister City awareness. "Ollie" joined the hearty band of Limerick members who walked behind the Limerick-Spokane banner.

Maybe even the momentary stalled vehicle is a metaphor for Sister City relations...expect a few challenging stops and starts, but work together and get things moving again.

After a Sunday morning excursion for the visiting mayor to a nearby lake and a hilltop winery, the weekend concluded

813th Mayor of Limerick Visits Spokane

Mayor Kevin Kiely, the 813th Mayor of Limerick City, Ireland, visited Spokane May 14 - 17 to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Spokane-Limerick Sister City relationship and to ride as Honorary Grand Marshal in the Lilac Festival/Armed Forces Day Torchlight Parade. Accompanying Kiely was Limerick's Director of Services, Oliver O'Loughlin for his first visit to Spokane.

Spokane Mayor Mary Verner greeted the Limerick delegation at a special reception in City Hall. Mayor Verner presented Mayor Kiely with a key to the city and a beautiful Pendleton blanket. Mayor Kiely presented a plaque commemorating the 300 year-old Limerick Treaty Stone.

Mayor Kiely and O'Loughlin were guests of the Lilac Festival Association at the group's annual banquet that evening. Other activities included a tour of the Spokane City and County Emergency Operations Center, a visit to local wineries, and a festive barbecue celebration. The hectic visit concluded with the 20-year rededication of the Spokane-Limerick Monument.

Spokane-Limerick Sister City Society members are planning a 20th Anniversary celebration in Limerick in September 2010. Plans include a rededication of the Spokane Walk along the River Shannon.

The student exchange program has been an important part of the two-city affiliation since it began in 1961. Plans are underway for a big 50th Anniversary Celebration next year when Japanese officials visit Spokane in May and Society members return the honor with a trip to Nishinomiya in September.


Board Openings
